

FILM REVIEW: BRAVEHEART

The film *Braveheart* is a 1995 epic historical medieval war drama. The story is based on Blind Harry's epic poem and was adapted for the screen by Randall Wallace.

The film won five Oscars in 1995 for Best Picture, Best Makeup, Best Cinematography, Best Sound Editing, and Best Director.

In the 13th century William Wallace leads his people in a rebellion against the tyranny of the English King.

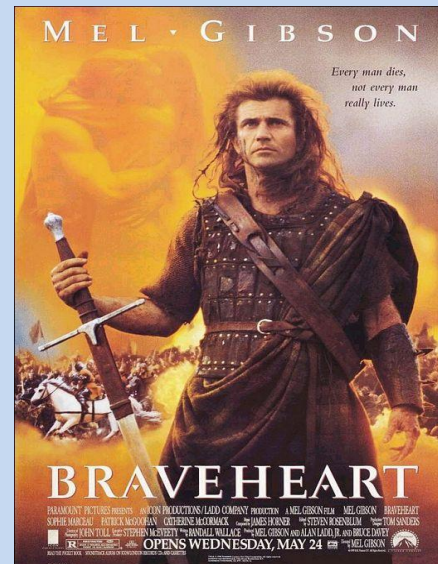
The story begins when his secret bride is executed for assaulting an English soldier who tried to rape her.
